


New Way Forward at RWJF





Healthy School Environments Strategic Objectives

What do we want to do?

- Advance systemic changes that create conditions to build health in school environments.
- Build demand to make healthy school environments the norm and not the exception across the U.S..
- Help to ensure children's social and emotional well-being, their ability to achieve a healthy weight, and school climates that support the conditions necessary to achieve these and related health outcomes.

Healthy School EnvironmentsFunding Objectives

RWJF seeks:

- 1. Increases in decision-maker awareness about the links between conditions and outcomes in health and education.
- 2. Opportunities for alignment across sectors to integrate approaches for physical, social, and emotional well-being in schools.
- 3. Identification and elevation of federal, state, and local policy changes that support physical health and social and emotional development.



Healthy School EnvironmentsFunding Objectives

- 4. Elevation of best practices that integrate health in educational settings.
- Increased demand by direct stakeholders to advance schools with a commitment to healthy environments.
- Prioritization of health equity both in approaches and outcomes.



Two-Phase Process

PHASE I

Call for Qualifications (CFQ)

- Open to all organizations that wish to submit their qualifications
- Time Frame:
 Mid-October 2016
 through early
 January 2017

PHASE II

Request for Proposals (RFP)

- By invitation only to top CFQ applicants
- Time Frame:

 Early January 2017
 through
 Mid-April 2017

Grants Awarded July 2017

One to two	\$1.5 million	July 2017 – July 2019

Overall objective:

Use research to facilitate the implementation of practices and policies.

Tasked with:

- Conducting timely and relevant research that addresses gaps in the evidence.
- Supporting meaningful translation and dissemination of evidence to research, policy, practice, and other stakeholder channels.



Policy Analysis and Development

Number of Grant Awards	TOTAL Amount of Grant Funding	Grant Period
One to two	\$2 million	July 2017 – July 2019

Overall objective:

Identify and elevate effective and inclusive policies that generate healthy, safe, and nurturing school climates

Tasked with:

- Building on existing efforts in which RWJF is already invested.
- Aggregate and promote existing policy leverage points and potentially build new ones.

- Conducting a planning phase to map opportunities and develop strategies.



Purpose

RWJF seeks to advance systemic changes that embed health in school environments. To help advance these systemic changes, the Foundation will support a collaborative, multipronged strategy with three complementary areas of work related to Research, Policy, and Strategic Action. This Call for Qualifications (CFQ) represents Phase I of a two-phase selection process designed to identify eligible organizations to lead each area of work, which include:

- Applied Research and Translation (one to two grants awarded) to use research to facilitate
 the implementation of practices and policies that generate healthy, safe, and nurturing school
 climates that help to reduce health disparities.
- Policy Analysis and Development (one to two grants awarded) to identify and elevate effective and equitable policies that generate healthy, safe, and nurturing school climates that help to reduce health disparities.
- 3. Strategic Action and Alignment (one lead grantee with core partners) to expand support from decision-makers, practitioners, and other key stakeholders who will ultimately be responsible for establishing and supporting policy, implementing best practices, and embracing school-change efforts that address the real conditions that support or impede children's health and learning.

NOTE: An organization may submit qualifications for one or more areas of work. **However, each** submission <u>must</u> be separate (applications for each body of work will be reviewed separately). To apply for an area of work, click on the appropriate link in one of the blue boxes to the right.





For each area of work that your organization is applying to lead, you are required to submit qualifications that include:

- Project Lead (required) A project lead from the applying organization should be named in your application(s).
- Project Co-Lead (optional) One additional project co-lead can be listed in the CFQ application.




This is the person with the responsibility for overseeing the project. This person will be the primary recipient of all key Foundation



Qualifications Narrative

5 pages, single spaced, 12-point font


- Qualifications Narrative Use this to describe your organizational capacity to lead the area of work. Address the following:
 - Background and expertise
 - Collaborators and partners
 - Organizational capacity and staffing
 - Challenges and areas of growth
 - If applicable: advantages and synergies gained by leading more than one area of work





Supporting Documents

- CV/Resume/Biosketch Required for Project Lead and Co-Lead (if named); you may provide one additional CV/resume/biosketch, if desired.
- Letters of Support Required for Strategic Action and Alignment work area; optional for other work areas (Applied Research and Translation and Policy Development and Analysis).
- Appendix Other information in support of your application.

Grant Award Start Date	July 15, 2017
Grantee Kickoff Meeting	Mid-July 2017
